1. Strengthen the capacity of local-level CSO's to build an inclusive and integrated enabling environment for addressing issues of Climate Change at the local level;
2. Support communities to identify, resource, implement and monitor climate resilient economies that are integrated, inclusive and specifically focused on utilizing ecosystem assets; and
3. Generate and share information related to climate resilient local economies across civil society networks in Fiji.



EXPECTED KEY OUTCOMES

1. Local-level Civil Society Organizations are effective and responsive to government and community climate change priorities
2. Communities are able to identify, implement and monitor ecosystems-based economies that are scalable, integrated and inclusive
3. Generation, sharing and uptake of information related to local, inclusive climate resilient economies are effective within both the northern parts of Fiji and across the wider Fiji Region.
